- Groups of 4
- Each group will have two research topics, so it is important to divide the tasks among group members.
- You will have **one** class period to conduct research, as well as to create your presentation (it could be PowerPoint, Prezi, MovieMaker, etc.) If your group doesn't finish, it will become homework because we only have a certain amount of time with the computers. I suggest teamwork-- part of the group conducting the research, while relaying that information to others who are creating the presentation.
- At the end of the week, each member of the group will be responsible for presenting an equal amount of the presentation
