Theme: Main message of a text

How is theme developed?

-dialogue, plot, setting, details given (and not given), conflict, diction

Theme examples: love, hate, war, passion, overcoming hardship, poverty, knowledge, repression, friendship, courage, perseverance, compassion

Theme statements:

Universal statements connecting the text to reality. It connects the message of a text to any reader, at any given time. Think of a theme statement as a specific statement which binds together the text with the real-world

What theme statements ARE NOT:

- -plot summaries
- -character analyses/tied to characters or setting
- -text-specific (specific details from the text itself)

Theme statement examples:

- -Society often tries to destroy anyone who does not conform to its mores.
- -Obsession on one strong emotion, such as love or hate, can lead one down a destructive path.
- -Repression leads to a loss of one's identity.
- -Everyone must face death in his or her own way.
